At Irvin High School, a Title 1 school, parents and community members are welcome and invited to participate in the various activities and involvement options we have at our school. We believe that active parent/community involvement is essential to ensure student academic success.

What does “school-wide Title I” mean?

Funds are used to improve academic achievement in reading and math. The Title I funds are used to hire para-professionals, improve curriculum, enhance parent involvement and extend learning time for students who need extra help. These opportunities are provided to students throughout the Irvin High School.

The following is a list of opportunities/activities for Irvin High School:

- During each school year, we will have at least two Family nights (Meet the Teachers). These nights will focus on various topic. The Policies and Procedures of our campus will be discussed, for example attendance, dress code and its importance. Clubs and Organizations. FAFSA Night.
- A newsletter is provided quarterly by the Region 16 to keep parents informed of various resources that can benefit their children’s education. This focus will allow parents to feel knowledgeable about what they see their child doing. Parents and community members can access it through our website or pick up a copy.
- Our School Improvement Team (CIT) meets once a month. The purpose of the CIT Council is to serve as the foundation for actively involving the school community and parents in designing learning goals as well as innovative projects, which enhance the educational experiences of our students. This team creates reviews and evaluates the school improvement plan. The team consists of administrators, teachers, parents and community members.

- Family involvement is welcomed here at Irvin High School. Coffee with the Principal, Parent/Teacher Conference, FAFSA Night, Meet the Rockets as well as throughout the school year to encourage parents and community members to be actively involved.

- Meet the Teachers Night : School-wide Parents Conference & Attendance Meeting

Irvin High School staff is available to communicate with parents through various methods: school newsletters, school messenger, notes home, phone calls to parents, email, Remind App and if necessary, interpreters are available. Parents are invited to provide input and assist in making decisions regarding their child's education.

- During our Parent/Teacher Conference (twice a year - semester) parents are provided with information regarding their children's progress and have the opportunity to converse with teacher to see what is needed to help student succeed.
- Parents may receive other assessment reports throughout the year that informed them on their child's progress towards their established goals. Each individual classroom has its own method of utilizing parent support depending on the needs of that particular classroom. Parent/Community volunteers are welcome at Irvin High School.

Política de Participación de los Padres

La preparatoria de Irvin, es una escuela de Título I, los padres y miembros de la comunidad son bienvenidos e invitados a participar en las diversas actividades y opciones de participación que tenemos en nuestra escuela. Creemos que la participación activa de padres / comunidad es esencial para garantizar el éxito académico de los estudiantes.

¿Qué significa "Título I de toda la escuela"?

Los fondos se utilizan para mejorar el rendimiento académico. Los fondos del Título 1 se utilizarán para contratar para profesionales, mejorar el plan de estudios, mejorar la participación de los padres y ampliar el tiempo de aprendizaje para los estudiantes que necesitan ayuda adicional. Estas oportunidades se brindan a los estudiantes a lo largo de toda la escuela.

La siguiente es una lista de oportunidades / actividades para Irvin:

- Durante cada año escolar, tendremos al menos dos noches familiares. Estas noches se enfocarán en varios temas, por ejemplo, la asistencia y su importancia. Las Políticas, procedimientos de nuestra escuela serán discutidos, clubes y organizaciones y otra información de importancia para la participación del estudiante
- La escuela publicará un boletín informativo todos los meses para mantener a los padres informados de las diversas iniciativas escolares y del distrito que se están llevando a cabo en la educación de sus hijos. Este enfoque permitirá a los padres sentirse bien acerca de lo que ven hacer a su hijo. Los miembros de la comunidad pueden acceder a través de nuestro sitio web o recoger una copia.
- Nuestro Equipo de Mejoramiento Escolar (CIT) se reúne una vez al mes. El objetivo del Consejo Escolar es servir como base para involucrar activamente a la comunidad escolar y a los padres en el diseño de objetivos de aprendizaje, así como proyectos innovadores que mejoren las experiencias educativas de nuestros alumnos. Este equipo crea revisiones y evalúa el plan de mejora escolar.
- La participación de la familia es bienvenida aquí en Irvin: Café con la directora, Noche Familiar - Conozca a los Maestros, Conferencia de Padres y Maestros, Noche de FAFSA,

Conozca a los Rockets así como a lo largo del año escolar para alentar a los padres y miembros de la comunidad a participar activamente.

El personal de la preparatoria Irvin está disponible para comunicarse con los padres a través de varios métodos: boletines escolares, notas al hogar, llamadas telefónicas a los padres, correo electrónico, recordatorios y, si es necesario, intérpretes estarán disponibles. Se invita a las familias a proporcionar aportes y ayudar a tomar decisiones con respecto a la educación de sus hijos.

- Durante nuestra Conferencia de Padres / Maestros (dos en el año escolar), los padres reciben información sobre el progreso de sus hijos.

- Los padres pueden recibir otros informes de evaluación durante el año que les informaron sobre el progreso de su hijo hacia sus metas establecidas. Cada salón de clases individual tiene su propio método de utilizar el apoyo de los padres en función de las necesidades de esa aula en particular. Los voluntarios de padres / comunidad son bienvenidos en la preparatoria de Irvin.
