Parent Engagement Policy 2022-2023

Mission and Vision

- Transmountain Early College High School will provide students the opportunity to earn both a STEAM-focused high school diploma and a two year Associate Degree, earned through El Paso Community College, within four years. Our goal is that ALL Transmountain Early College High School graduates will have the skills and confidence necessary to transition successfully to a 4-year university, military service or a career in their chosen field.

Transmountain Early College High School (TMECHS) will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its district-wide parental engagement plan under Section 1112 of the ESSA.

- Parents will provide input and serve on the campus improvement team (CIT).
- Parents will serve on the committee to develop the school-parent compact.
- Parents will provide the district/campus feedback through a parent survey.
- Parents will evaluate the Title I Parent Involvement activities.
- Parents will serve on a committee to develop the district parental engagement policy.

TMECHS will take the following actions to involve parents in the process of school review and improvement under Section 1116 of the ESSA.

- Conduct an Annual Title I meeting at a convenient time for families, encouraging parents to share input/suggestions and ask questions.
- Parents are invited to serve on district/campus parental involvement activities along with school activities (for example: orientation, coffee with the principal and Parental Involvement meetings) to provide feedback and evaluate the activities.
- Parents will have the opportunity to participate, provide suggestions regarding the education of their children. TMECHS will respond in a timely manner

TMECHS will provide the following necessary coordination, technical assistance, and other support to assist in planning and implementing effective parental engagement involvement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance.

- Social-Emotional Learning Information.

TMECHS will coordinate and integrate parental engagement strategies with the following other programs.

TMECHS will take the following action to conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parental engagement policy in improving the quality of its Title I, Part A schools. The evaluation will include identifying barriers to greater participation by parents in parent engagement activities (with particular attention to parents who are economically

disadvantaged, are disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are of any racial or ethnic minority background). The school district will use the findings of the evaluation about its parental engagement policy and activities to design strategies for more effective parental engagement and to revise, if necessary (and with the involvement of parents), the Parental Engagement Policy.

- Campus will distribute a parent survey during the school year, parents will be encouraged to complete this and provide input. The Parental Engagement Leader, parents, faculty, and staff, will review and disaggregate the data and use it to design strategies that will increase the effectiveness of parental engagement.

TMECHS will build capacity of school staff and parents to create strong parental engagement programs, in order to ensure effective engagement of parents and to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement. TMECHS will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, in understanding topics such as the following.

- The state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments.
- The requirements of Title I, Part A as presented in Annual Title I meeting.
- How to monitor child's progress and work with educators.
- Progress Reports, Report Cards, and Parent/Teacher Conferences.

Will work with parents as equal partners, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by hosting the following and providing parents with information in a timely manner.

- Parent Teacher Association (PTA)
- Campus Improvement Team (CIT) Meetings
- Volunteer in Public Schools (VIPS) Program
- Business/School/Community/ Career Day Events

Will take the following actions to ensure that information related to students, parental engagement programs, meetings, and other activities is provided in an easy to understand format.

- Take-Home Flyers.
- Parent/Teacher Conferences/Meetings and phone calls home.
- Up to date calendar of events on our campus website.

Discretionary activities that the campus, in consultation with its parents, chooses to undertake the following to build the parents capacity for involvement in the school system and child's academic achievement under Section 1118 (e) of the ESSA.

- Providing academic training for parents.
- Allocate funds associated with parental involvement activities.
- Educate parents on enhancing child's academic success and social-emotional well-being.
- Arranging school meetings at various times in order to maximize parental engagement.
- Establishing a campus parent advisory council to provide advice on all matters parent related.
