# WALK YOUR SCHEDULE

## WEEK OF JULY 19 - 22

### 8:30 - 11:30 & 1:00 - 4:00

Wiggs MS would like welcome all students and parents to come to Wiggs MS during the week of July 19 - July 22 to walk with their child and find their assigned classrooms. The school will be open from 8:30 - 11:30 & 1:00 - 4:00 each day. The Wiggs Administration will be on campus to answer all questions that you may have. (Faculty will not be on campus). The Wiggs MS PTA will be located in the Breezeway for purchase of Wiggs MS clothing and PE uniforms.

Also, information for lockers, first day activities, busses, books bell schedule and more will be available in the Administration office, on our website [episd.org/wiggs](http://episd.org/wiggs), and Facebook.

## General Information

Monday August 02 and Tuesday August 03. Wiggs will open the doors at 7:00 a.m. so that you may come in early to find the students Advisory class. Yes, parents are welcome to come in with them.

**LOCKERS** - Assigned by the students 1<sup>st</sup> period teacher during the first week of school. Students will need 2 locks, one for their locker and one for their PE locker. Key locks may be used but make sure to have two keys available, one for the student and one for the teacher that assigns the locker. Sharing lockers is not permitted. **HINT:** Have them practice their combination several times.

**BUSES** – Buses will drop off in the front of the school and pick up (after school) on California St., South side of school. There will be designated areas for each bus. You may pick up bus cards from the Mr. Gonzalez, Assistant Principal, during the 1<sup>st</sup> week of school, during lunch. Students will be allowed to ride their designated bus the first week of school without a bus card but must have the following week. Students may also pick up their bus card during the lunch shift. After the first bus card additional cards will be \$2.00 dollars. Students **MUST** present their bus card to the driver to be allowed on the bus.

**MATERIALS** - The school supply list is on our website, [episd.org/wiggs](http://episd.org/wiggs). Teacher may require certain items for their subject. **HINT:** Students should begin the practice of carrying their morning class materials with them and then switch at lunch and carry only their afternoon materials. After school they can go to their lockers for all materials that must go home.

**REMINDER:** Laptops assigned to the student are the responsibility of that child. Please remind your child not to share laptops or usernames and passwords.

**LAPTOPS** - Please make sure students charge their laptops each night and they also carry the laptops in the cases provided, along with their chargers. Students should not share their usernames or passwords with others.

If you are an incoming 5<sup>th</sup> grade student and do not have a laptop due to, optioned out of a device, as a 5<sup>th</sup> grade student. Make sure to complete the laptop form in the online registration packet so that you will be issued a laptop through EPISD Technology Services.

If you are a new student to EPISD you will follow the same process as listed above and will be issued through EPISD Technology Services.

Ultimately, the student is responsible for the care and use of their assigned laptop

**DROP OFF AREAS** – Please drop/pick up students at the back of the school in the drop off zone on Wright St. before school. They will proceed to either the football field or cafeteria and remain there until the bell rings. No students are allowed in the front of the school in the morning.

**UNIFORMS** – Students must be in uniform the 1<sup>st</sup> day of school.

# Wiggs Middle School Uniform Policy 2021-2022

The SAFETY of our students is the primary purpose of our uniform policy.

**\*\*Items not specifically listed below as acceptable may not be worn on campus.\*\***

## Pants, Shorts, Skorts, and Skirts

- Solid (no logo) navy or khaki-colored pants
- Must be pulled up to the waist
- Pleated, regular, or relaxed fit only
- Must fit the waist size, pants length *must not* fall below the tops of the shoes, shorts length cannot be below the knee and *cannot be* shorter than mid-thigh when hands are held straight at the student's sides, capri length is acceptable for females
- One-piece polo/skirt combination allowed

## NOT PERMITTED AT ANY TIME

- Mini-skirts and ankle-length skirts are prohibited for safety reasons
- Cut, frayed, or slit bottom hems, rolled-up pants
- Patches, embroidery, or drawings may not be added to any part of the uniform
- Pants that are **SKINNY** or **TIGHT**, *stretchy, jean-type material, hip-hugger, low-rider, wide-legged, baggy fit, bell-bottomed, cargo, multiple pocket, carpenter style, joggers*
- Leggings or jeggings

## Belts and Stockings

- Belts are optional
- If worn, belts must be inside belt loops, belt buckles may not be larger than the belt loops, they cannot be a safety issue, associated with gang activities, or deemed inappropriate
- Long stockings and tights may be worn, but only **plain white, gray, UTEP orange, or navy blue** and must be worn under the uniform

## Shirts and Sweatshirts

- **Solid** (no logo or name brand) **white, gray, navy blue, or UTEP orange** polo shirts
- 3- button maximum, with short or long sleeves that *may not be rolled or modified in any way*
- **Shirts may not be altered in any way**
- Shirts must be tucked in at all times and be long enough to remain tucked in while seated, they may not be tight
- Undergarments may not show through the shirt
- **Solid** sweatshirts, hoodies, or zip-up sweaters in gray, UTEP orange, or navy blue are permitted for the classroom, *without logo or name brands* worn over polo shirts
- Sweatshirts may also be worn during PE, may not be worn around the waist
- T-shirts/undershirts/turtlenecks are optional and *must be* solid white, gray, UTEP orange, or navy blue *without logo, designs, or name brands (to include, but not limited to):* pictures, Moose, Polo, Hollister, Abercrombie, mascots, sports teams, etc.
- **PE t-shirts may not be worn under uniform polo shirts**

## Jackets/Coats/Windbreakers/non-Wiggs Sweatshirts

- **Must be stored in lockers throughout the day and may not be worn in classrooms**
- May be worn before and after school; during lunch **ONLY** if weather warrants it (discretion of administration)
- Must be age appropriate and may not be a distraction or safety issue
- Plaid flannel shirt-type jackets are not permitted

### Shoes

- Closed shoes, tennis shoes, and casual shoes are allowed
- Steel-toed shoes/boots, flip-flops, opened toe, backless shoes, sandals and house-shoe type slippers *are NOT permitted*
- Seasonal boots *during colder weather* are permitted

### Jewelry, Hair Color, Makeup, and Other Items

- Jewelry must be age appropriate and not related to gangs
- If jewelry becomes a distraction (i.e., plastic bracelets) or safety issue, school administrators will address the matter on an individual basis
- No hair accessories that distract from the learning environment (as per administration's discretion)
- *Necklaces* must be kept under the shirt
- *Pierced earrings* are acceptable with limitations
- *Not allowed: body-piercing jewelry, such as studs in the lip, nose, eyebrow, or tongue, "grilz," gauges, large hoops, spikes, nuts/bolts; tattoos of ANY type – permanent or temporary*

### NOT PERMITTED AT ANYTIME

- Choke chains, chokers, and wallet chains
- *Unnatural colors of hair (meaning any color that is different than the student's natural hair color), such as, but not limited to: red, orange, pink, purple, green, blue, or bleached hair*
- When in doubt, school administrators will determine inappropriate hair color and issue of distraction
- Design/lines cut into hair/scalp, shaved eye brows
- Scarves
- Writing on skin, including tattoos; stickers on face
- Overalls, caps, beanies, hats, hair nets, bandanas
- Clothing with offensive, racist, or inappropriate words, scenes, signs, slogans, or symbols
- This includes but is not limited to: clothing that promotes cigarettes, alcohol products, illegal drugs, or gang identification
- When in doubt, school administrators will determine inappropriate attire

### \*\*OPTIONAL AND SPECIAL DAYS\*\*

- "**Spirit/College Monday, Wednesdays, and Friday**" – Students may wear Wiggs extracurricular activities 'shirts (still must be tucked) with uniform pants/shorts/skirts on Mondays and Fridays; Wednesdays, students may choose to wear a college /University T-shirt.
- "**Optional Dress**" – **DAYS TBD BY WIGGS ADMIN** - Optional dress will be allowed within appropriate guidelines, *to include, but not limited to:* no tight pants, no torn pants, no bare shoulders or midriff, no short shorts, no bare toes, no gang- or drug-related clothing; jackets and coats are to be stored in lockers, jeans should follow uniform rules for appropriateness and safety; **JEANS WITH FRAYS, CUTS, HOLES, SLITS, PATCHES, DRAWINGS, OR EMBROIDERY ARE NOT PERMITTED**
- *Administrators will determine inappropriate clothing*

\*\*Wiggs 'extracurricular activities T-shirts, hoodies, etc. are considered to have appropriate logos.

## Política de Uniforme 2021-2022

La SEGURIDAD de nuestros alumnos es el propósito principal de nuestra política de uniforme. Todos los estudiantes deben llevarse el uniforme todo el tiempo que estén en el campus.

**\*\*Los artículos no mencionados específicamente abajo como aceptables no podrán ser llevados puestos en el campus. \*\***

### **Pantalón Corto/short, Falda- short y Falda**

- Deberán ser de color kaki o azul marino sólido, sin logotipo.
- Deberá usarse a la cintura.
- Podrá llevar pinzas, ser de tipo delgado (slim), o relajado únicamente;
- Nada a la cadera o debajo de la cadera, el largo del pantalón no puede pasar de lasuela del zapato; el largo de los shorts no deberá pasar de la rodilla, y no puede ser más corto que el largo hasta donde lleguen las puntas de los dedos de las manos del estudiante si las pone derechas a lo largo de su costado (deberá llegar a la mitad del muslo.) El largo "capri" es aceptable en los pantalones para las jovencitas.
- El uniforme de una pieza de camisola polo y falda, está permitida. No se permite en ningún momento.
- Mini-faldas así como faldas hasta el tobillo por razones de seguridad; bastillas cortadas, deshilachadas o con un corte vertical. Pantalones remangados, los parches, los bordados, y los dibujos no se pueden tener en el uniforme.

### **Cintos y Calcetas**

- Los cintos son opcionales; si se utiliza, debe ser puesto dentro de las presillas.
- Las hebillas no deben ser más grandes que las trabillas de los pantalones. No deben ser un artículo que sea peligroso o que esté relacionado con pandillas.
- Se pueden usar calcetas largas, pero solo si son de color blanco, gris, anaranjado al estilo de UTEP o azul marino. Deben ser puestos debajo del uniforme.

### **Camisas y Sudaderas**

- Camisa polo sólidas (no logotipos o marcas) \*\* blancas, grises, azul marino y anaranjado UTEP, con un máximo de tres botones, con mangas cortas o largas las cuales no se podrán remangar o modificar de ninguna manera, al igual que las camisas.
- La camisa debe estar fajada todo el tiempo y debe ser lo suficientemente larga para que permanezca fajada al estar sentado. La ropa interior no debe translucirse por la camisa.
- Las sudaderas, suéteres o sudadera con capuchón, deberán ser de un color sólido: blancas, anaranjadas o azul marino, sin logotipo o marca visible. Deberán ser portadas arriba de la camisa polo, se podrán usar durante educación física. Las sudaderas no se podrán portar a la cintura. Sudaderas con logotipos de universidades pueden ser puestas cualquier día de clase.
- Las camisetas, camisas, cuellos de tortuga son opcionales; Deben ser de color blanco, gris, azul marino o naranja UTEP, sin logotipo, diseños o marcas de nombre. Ejemplos de logos (para incluir, sin limitarse a): imágenes, Moose, Polo, Hollister, Abercrombie, mascotas, equipos de deporte, etc.
- Las camisetas de la clase de educación física no deben ser puestas debajo del uniforme.

### **Chamarras/abrigos/rompe vientos**

- Deberán guardarse en sus armarios durante la hora de clases y no se podrán portar dentro de los salones de clases.
- Podrán portarse antes y después de horas de clases y durante la hora de la comida si el clima lo requiere.

- Debe de ser adecuado a su edad y no debe ser motivo de distracción o de inseguridad.
- No se permiten chamarras de franela a cuadros, tipo camisa.

### **Zapatos**

- Se permite usar zapatos cerrados, zapato deportivo (tenis) o zapato casual.
- No se permite usar zapato/bota con punta de metal, sandalia de pata de gallo, zapato con talón descubierto, cualquier tipo de huarache o sandalia y cualquier tipo de zapato de casa o pantufla.
- Se permite usar botas durante días de clima fríos.

### **Joyería, color del cabello, maquillaje, y otros artículos**

- La joyería debe ser apropiada a la edad y que no se relacione con ningún tipo de pandillas. Si la joyería da pie a algún tipo de distracción (ej. brazaletes de plástico) o es motivo de inseguridad, la dirección de la escuela se hará cargo de la situación y tratará el caso individualmente.
- Los collares deben mantenerse debajo de la camisa. Las orejas perforadas dentro de la razón son aceptables.
- **No se permite: joyería de perforación corporal, como piezas en la boca, nariz, ceja o lengua o "grilz" (joyería dental).** Las orejas pueden estar perforadas siempre y cuando sea moderadamente (no se permite: **gauges, arracadas grandes, picos, tornillos/tuercas; no se permiten tatuajes de ningún tipo o en ningún momento, ya sean permanentes o temporales.**

### **No se permite por ningún motivo**

- Gargantilla, gargantilla de cadenas o cadenas para carteras.
- Colores de cabello artificial tales como, pero no limitados a: rojo, anaranjado, rosa, morado, verde, azul.
  - Cuando haya duda, la dirección escolar determinará si el color es inapropiado y causa de distracción.
- Diseños hechos en el cabello o cuero cabelludo, cejas rasuradas.
- Bufandas
- Escribir en la piel, incluyendo tatuajes; calcomanías en la cara
- Overoles, cachuchas, gorros, sombreros, mallas para el cabello o pañuelos.
- Ropa con palabras, mensajes, diseños, escenas, símbolos o eslóganes ofensivos y/o racistas; esto incluye ropa que promocióne productos alcohólicos, cigarros, drogas ilegales, o propaganda de pandillas. Cuando exista una duda, la administración determinará si el atuendo es inapropiado.

### **\*\*DÍAS ESPECIALES\*\***

- "Días de Amor por la Escuela/Universidades" — Los estudiantes de Wiggs podrán llevarse las camisetas de las actividades extracurriculares (deberán de fajarse también) con pantalón/short/falda del uniforme los lunes y viernes; los miércoles los estudiantes podrán usar una camiseta de la universidad de su elección.
- "Día de Vestido Libre" - **DETERMINADO POR LA ADMINISTRACIÓN DE WIGGS** - Ropa diaria regular será permitida dentro de las pautas apropiadas, para incluir, pero no limitado a: no se puede usar pantalones apretados, pantalones desgarrados, hombros expuestos o camisa corta, no chiqui-shorts, no dedos de pie expuestos, no ropa relacionada a pandillas o drogas; los pantalones de mezclilla deben seguir las reglas de uniforme de lo apropiado y la seguridad. **NO SE PERMITEN LOS PANTALONES VAQUEROS CON DESHILACHA, CORTES, AGUJEROS, RANURAS, PARCHES, DIBUJOS, O BORDADO.**
- Los administradores tienen la opción de especificar o determinar ropa inapropiada.

\*\* Los logotipos de las camisetas de apoyo "Spirit" están considerados como apropiados.
