Parent Engagement Policy

2023-2024

Home and school collaboration is an important part of our learners' educations. Parental Engagement is a key component to the overall success of each learner. We here at the Young Women's Academy strive to establish partnerships with parents, faculty and community. We believe that, together utilizing Title 1 federal fund and guidelines, we will meet our goals to support our learners to achieve high levels of learning. Title 1 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act provides financial assistance to local educational agencies (LEAs) and schools with high numbers or high percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure that all children meet challenging state academic standards.

To achieve these goals, the Young Women's Academy will meet all Title 1 requirements by:

- Sending out surveys each year to parents and guardians to get a better understanding of what
 interests or activities would like to see offered though our Family Engagement Program.
- Hosting at least one Family Engagement Workshop each month based on the results of the Parent Interest Survey
- Allow for two attendance options on different days, at convenient but various times, for the
 Title 1, Part A Annual Meeting, to which all families of the school participate under this part and
 are explained their rights and importance of their involvement.
- Affirm that Young Women's will offer a flexible number of Title 1 meetings, such as Coffee with the Principal, CIT Meetings, Parent Teacher Conferences (twice yearly), either in the morning or evening on separate days with administrative staff to discuss issues and to keep informed on what is going on at our campus, and may provide if deemed necessary and funds are available transportation, child care, and home visits.
- Reviewing and amending as needed, our School-Parent Compact and our Campus Family
 Engagement Policy each year to meet the needs of our learners and their families. We invite
 families and our community to help us review these documents and our Family Engagement
 Program as a whole at least once year.
- Informing parents and families of all Parent Engagement activities in a timely manner by way of social media, text messages, emails, flyers, school messaging systems, and/or school marquee.
- Providing parents and families with a descriptive explanation of the curriculum in use at our campus, as well as the forms that measure academic assessment, student progress, and the achievement levels of the State Academic Standards. Assistance in understanding these topics will be provided as needed.

- Providing materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve achievements. Examples: literacy training and technology training.
- Giving parents and families the opportunity to join and/or attend our monthly Campus Improvement Team (CIT) meeting where they may formulate suggestions and participate in decisions relating to the education of their children. If at any time a parent does not find our Campus Improvement Plan satisfactory, the school will submit any parent comments to the LEA (Local Education Agency).
- Helping parents and families understand the technology and software programs, such as Schoology and Parent Portal, available to them to access and monitor their child's progress.
- Using all technology available to stay connected and communicate with our learners' families
 in a language they can understand. We feel that if parents are able to see what their students
 are achieving at school in real times, it will facilitate a positive environment where learners
 stay on top of their assignments and are less likely to fall behind
- Educating facilitators, administration, and staff in the value of parent/family contributions to the school and the education of students. We will teach faculty how to reach out, communicate with, and work with parents, as equal partners in the building of a school culture that promotes strong ties between parents, school, and community.
- Coordinating and integrating parental involvement activities with other Federal, State, and local programs whenever feasible.
- Ensuring the Information related to school and parent programs is available in a format and language that parents can understand.

Recognizing that family is the primary influence in a child's life, the Young Women's Academy will strive to exceed Title 1 requirements by:

- Providing a campus that is inviting, safe and inclusive. Whether it is for parent-teacher conferences, to eat lunch with their child, to volunteer, or to attend an event, we will work to make families feel welcome and a part of our YWA family.
- Always welcoming feedback and comments. We want families to know they have a voice in their child's education.

The Policy was last reviewed and amended on April 12,2023, in collaboration with parents, faculty and community representatives. The goal in reviewing this document was to set forth a cornerstone policy to build a support network for our learners. This network will consist of family, facilitators, administrators, faculty, community, and the learners themselves. We believe that this strong base of family engagement will help us meet our goals, to improve achievement, reduce absenteeism, and build parents' confidence in the education process.
