



Chapin High School P-TECH

Student and Parent Commitment Form (Due by January 12, 2024)

We understand that students accept invitations to Chapin High School’s PTECH Computer Science program as an optional program because of the unique focus of the courses and work-based training opportunities.

We recognize that acceptance to the Chapin PTECH is a unique opportunity. Because of our relationships with El Paso Community College and partner business, we recognize that P-TECH students will practice professional business standards and behaviors to help their success in the program. We recognize that compliance with those standards and the scheduled course selections are required parts of attendance and continued successful enrollment at Chapin High School and at El Paso Community College.

We understand that acceptable conduct, academic progress, and regular attendance are mandatory for continued, successful enrollment in the Chapin PTECH program. We agree to abide by all El Paso ISD and El Paso Community College policies, including discipline, attendance, grade policies. Students participating in work-site experiences agree to abide by all employment rules and assigned responsibilities of the participating corporation.

Students who do not maintain academic and behavior standards will be subject to a probationary period before being dismissed from the PTECH program and returned to their home campuses. Severe disciplinary or attendance issues may result in immediate dismissal and revocation of transfer by EPISD or EPCC administration.

Students who enter the program are enrolling in their freshman year (9th grade). They continue each year by adding more graduation, and EPCC options, with possible work and certification opportunities.

PTECH students enter the work based education program understanding that their academic and work-study schedules will meet and possibly exceed minimum graduation requirements AND will include allowable sequences of CTE recommended courses from the PTECH program course menu. These courses are based on frameworks from Texas Education Code Sec. 29.533 and Texas Administrative Code 102.1095 Course sequences include approved Texas CTE Programs of Study, and Dual Credit requirements from El Paso Community College.

Student remain enrolled in the PTECH program for the entire school year. Transfer students who elect to withdraw from the PTECH program during the year will return to their home campus (or may transfer to another school) for the remainder of the school year. We understand that based on EPISD current district practices, students remain enrolled as a Campus PTECH transfer unless they withdraw from Chapin High School, or are removed and returned to their home school.
