Problem Statement 2: A large number of students miss the opportunity to attempt their certification exam within their program. **Root Cause:** A large number of students do not have the financial means to pay for their certification(s) exams.

CCTE consistently works toward:

- **Building a team of high qualified CTE instructors and Core teachers. Assign a mentor to all new faculty and staff.**
